Advice for Child to Self-Isolate: all students in Cambridge Campus Year 8

Dear Parent / Carer,

We have been advised that a member of our school community in the **Cambridge Campus Year 8** 'bubble' has tested positive for COVID-19.

Following the advice from Public Health England and the Department for Education, we have taken the decision that, for the safety of identified students in this 'bubble' and their families, **all students in the Cambridge Campus Year 8 bubble will need to self-isolate at home from today up to and including 15th July.**

If your child is well at the end of the period of self-isolation, then they can **return to school on Friday 16th July.**

We are asking you to do this to reduce the further spread of COVID 19 to others in the community. Other members of your household can continue normal activities provided your child does not develop symptoms within the 10-day self-isolation period. What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not come to school and should remain at home for at least **10 days** from the date when their symptoms appeared. **Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test> or by calling 119.**

- All other household members who remain well, must stay at home and not leave the house for 10 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'.

- The 10-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.
- Household members should not go to work, school or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home.
- Household members staying at home for 10 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community
- If you are able, move any vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) out of your home, to stay with friends or family for the duration of the home isolation period.

Symptoms of COVID 19

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- new continuous cough and/or
- high temperature and/or
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19

Do

- wash your hands with soap and water often – do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
