- Be safe, by following the instructions of the staff supervising



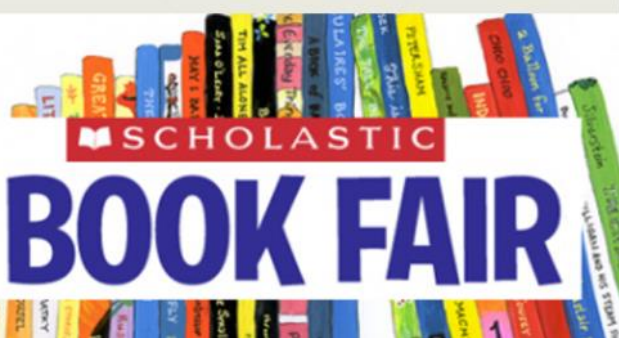
The first class to win the Playground Diamond Ticket Award is.....**KANGAROO CLASS!**

This week in year 6...

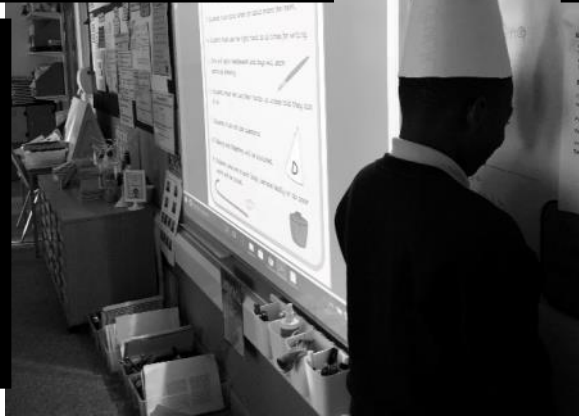
We went back in time to the mid-1800s to experience life as a Victorian school child.

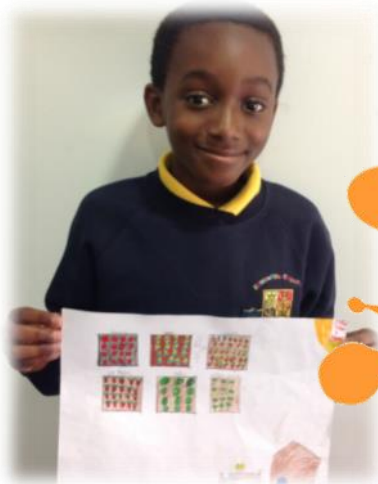
