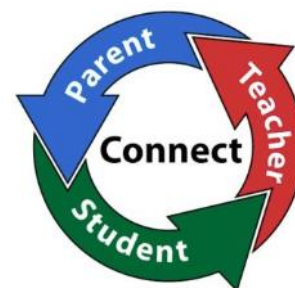

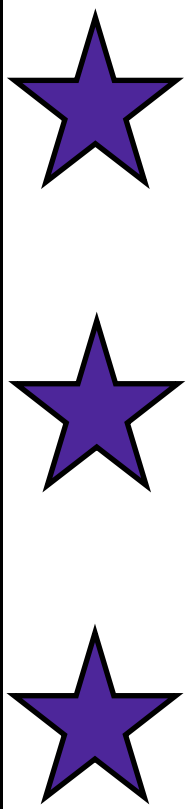

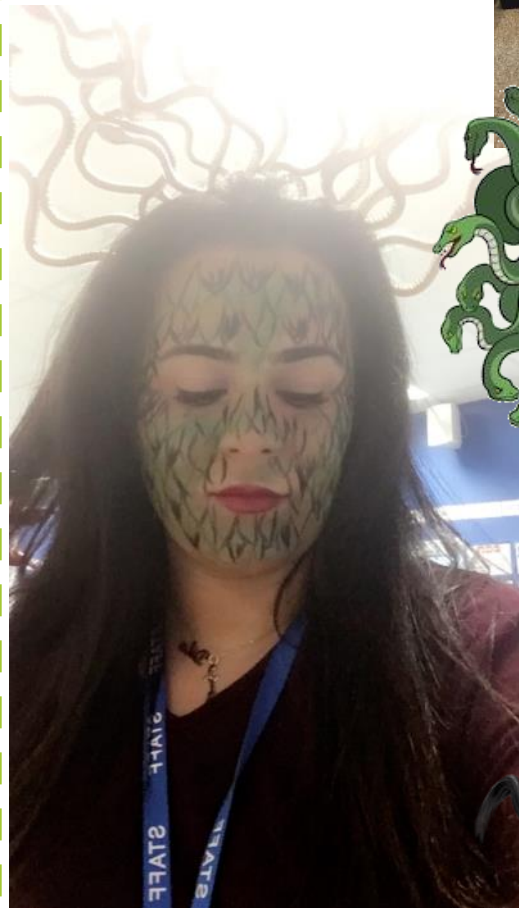


MYTHS & LEGENDS

Palindromes

Mrs Arnel's Maths Challenge

Palindromes are words (or numbers) that read the same both ways. They are thought to have been used back in 79AD in Ancient Greece, but used in whole sentences and not just singular words. In terms of differentiation for your class, that would be incredible. The most basic palindromes are MUM and DAD. Regardless of which way they are written, they read the same. Here are some more basic palindromes-

Rows of coins



1. Take five coins: 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p.
Put them in a row using these clues.
The total of the first three coins is 27p.
The total of the last three coins is 31p.
The last coin is double the value of the first coin.

2. Take six coins: two 1p, two 2p and two 5p.
Put them in a row using these clues.
Between the two 1p coins there is one coin.
Between the two 2p coins there are two coins.
Between the two 5p coins there are three coins.
