Finally, as this is the last newsletter of the term, I would like to wish you all a restful, peaceful time with family and friends over the festive period. I look forward to your continued support in 2019.

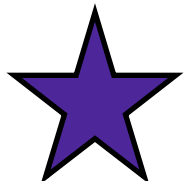
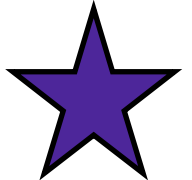
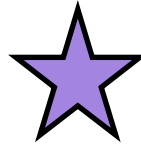
